SPSI proudly presents distinguished psychoanalyst Emily A. Kuriloff, PsyD, author of *Contemporary Psychoanalysis and the Legacy of the Third Reich*.

In this program, Dr. Kuriloff will explore the impact of the European Holocaust on all that we know and believe about psychoanalytic theory and praxis. From Budapest to Paris, she reminds us, the predominantly Jewish leaders in the field were forced to flee their homelands on fear of death. That a good part of the psychoanalytic community endured in exile is itself remarkable. And yet, in the end, the twentieth century belonged as much to Hitler as it did to Freud.

Using primary, often unpublished source material as well as personal interviews conducted with émigré and survivor analysts, Dr. Kuriloff explores the impact of the Shoah on psychoanalysis in the USA, Britain, France, Germany, and Israel. She will also present conversations with second and third generation analysts, professionals who are informed by the pain and triumph of their parents' and mentors' Holocaust stories, yet more willing to view truth as a construction, and to anticipate the psychotic dissolution of a single reality at any moment.

The impact upon our work of current and ongoing socio political trauma and upheaval will constitute the final segment of the program.

Impassioned, erudite, and timely, this is a presentation not to be missed.



PRESENTER

Emily Kuriloff, PsyD is Director of Clinical Education, and a Training and Supervising Psychoanalyst at the William Alanson White Institute in New York. She is former Book Review Editor, and is on the editorial board of the *Journal of Contemporary Psychoanalysis*. Her scholarly interests include the intersection between culture, politics, and psychoanalytic theory and practice, and the relationship between action and reflection, body and mind. Her book, *Contemporary Psychoanalysis and The Legacy of the Third Reich*, explores how the trauma of the Shoah transformed the development of psychoanalysis at its apex and beyond, and was published by Routledge in 2014. A volume of essays exploring the impact upon prominent psychoanalysts who have returned to their homelands after exile or immigration is forthcoming. It will be edited by Dr. Kuriloff and Dr. Evelyn Hartman and published by Routledge next year.

ORGANIZERS

Flaviane Ferreira, MD, is a psychoanalyst graduated from SPSI where she is an instructor in the child and adult programs. She earned her MD and completed child and adult psychiatry residency at the University of Campinas (UNICAMP) school of medical sciences in Brazil. She worked in public mental health settings for children, adolescents, adults and families before relocating to the USA in 1999. She maintains a private practice in Bellevue where she sees children, adolescents and adults.

Mary Murphy, EdD, LICSW, is a graduate of SPSI's Adult Psychotherapy Program and is a member of its Continuing Education Committee and Adult Psychoanalytic Psychotherapy Program committee. She sees adults in her private practice in lower Queen Anne.
